Without YOUR SUPPORT, the Hall cannot function at it's current, minimum levels.

None of these funds are used for our current building preservation fund that will eventually insulate and re-side the Hall. We have over 500 homes in the Cougar Gulch area and to date, our membership dues come from less than 75 families.






Wreath Making Parties

Worley Highway Districts Notes





Keeping roads cleared for traffic during morning and evening commuting periods is the district's number one priority this winter. Sometimes, as with the last storm, it takes all our allotted hours and then some. Then we catch up on maintenance and get ready for the next storm. I want to sincerely thank our motivated crew!

Looking back to the end of October, the district completed repairs on Burton Road. The problem was inadequate culverts to handle spring runoff, resulting in Bozard Creek overflowing the road and dumping large quantities of gravel in a prime trout stream. This led to the gravel having to be replaced on the road year after year, a repetitive and costly routine. The new bridge will allow a much larger volume of water to flow under the road. This effort was a joint project with the Coeur d'Alene Tribe.

Also squeezed before winter was a project that reduced a rock outcrop at Tall Pines and Loffs Bay Roads that resulted in doubling

the sight distance at this intersection and made a left hand turn much less risky. Some the boulders pulled from the outcrop will be used on the Sgt. Moore Memorial.

Previously reported, we completed the Clemetson Road project, and started an improvement project on Carnie Road. Repairs were made on Greensferry Road, which had been partially blocked by a slide, and two-lane traffic was restored.

During the next two months the district board, in consultation with the district supervisor, will set priorities on what projects we will try to wedge in between our normal road maintenance tasks for 2018.

Most important during winter, start your trip early, slow it down and enjoy the ride.
